### ATTENDANCE

The whole school attendance total is currently running at 96.30% which is lower than we would expect at this time of year. The final attendance figure for Academic Year 2016/17 was 95.50% and in order to improve or maintain this, we need to make sure that every pupil attends school regularly, therefore your continued support and co-operation is appreciated. The Welsh Assembly Government's target for pupil attendance is 95%. Anything under this figure could mean that the Educational Welfare Service will contact you to find out why your child has been absent from school.

#### CALLIO Attendance Campaign



#### Adoremus – Eucharistic Congress, Liverpool


Adoremus in Liverpool was an event, which in my opinion, strengthened my faith.

On September 8<sup>th</sup> this year, JR, along with some representatives from the Archdiocese of Cardiff, attended 'Adoremus – A Eucharistic Congress' in Liverpool. This Catholic event was facilitated by the Diocese of Liverpool and was attended by thousands of people around England and Wales.

Our main venue was Echo Arena, and as soon as I entered the hall, my breath was taken away by the hundreds and thousands of people who travelled hours to be here.

Bishop Robert Barron captivated me with his talks about the Eucharist and the deeper meaning about the mystery of the Mass. In addition, there were many different acts such as a drama which showed a group of youth losing their faith because Jesus did not physically reveal himself. Throughout the drama, Jesus walked around and called out to the individuals and told them to stay strong, although they could not feel or hear him. It led me to realise that the reason for the declining faith within us youth was because we aren't physically touched. We don't take the time to spiritually nurture ourselves as we do with our physical being. Adoremus showed me more to what we, as youth, would consider being a Catholic - going to mass and living our Christian lives. However, as Bishop Robert Barron reminded us, our faith is a universal body of believers.

After the event, Julie expressed how impressed she was with the behaviour of our pupils and more importantly, the engagement of our young people in the Q+A session.







### Geography

The weather was much better and pupils were able to collect pedestrian flows, complete their surveys and speak to members of the public.

#### Past papers will be sent home on a weekly basis as homework.

These must be submitted a week later and will be marked by the teacher or self- marked by pupils. Past papers should be completed steadily over the course of the week so that pupils can refer to books, online support or seek help from their teacher when necessary. All questions should be attempted. Parents will be informed if pupils fail to meet submission deadlines or show insufficient effort.

Frequent consolidation is crucial. To support students' retention of key skills pupils will also be set weekly online revision tasks on either MyMaths or MathsWatch (login details were sent home last term).

#### **MOBILE PHONES**

The school has a very clear policy about the use of Mobile Phones by pupils on the school premises.

Pupils are **NOT** allowed to use their phones under any circumstances. If a pupil needs to contact home in an emergency, their Head of Year, Assistant Head of Year or the school office will assist them in this.

If a pupil has their phone confiscated, it is returned at the end of the day. If, however, it is subsequently confiscated, then this will involve a longer period of confiscation of up to a week. If a child's bus pass is on their phone, the office will lend them the bus fare to get home, but please inform the school via email (<a href="mailto:bmullins@cardiff.gov.uk">bmullins@cardiff.gov.uk</a>) if you would prefer to make arrangements yourself to collect your child rather than let them make their own way home without their mobile phone.

Clearly, it is in everyone's interest that pupils do not have their phones taken and if parents could remind their children about this we, as a school, would be grateful as it makes life much easier for all concerned.



### SCHOOL BUS TRAVEL BEHAVIOUR CODE

#### TO BE SAFE

- When the bus arrives, wait for it to stop before boarding
- Get on and off the bus carefully pushing or rushing can cause accidents
- Always wear your seat belt and stay in your seat for the whole journey – it could save your life
- On a school bus, stay in your seat for the whole journey
- . On a public bus, find a seat if one is available
- Store your bag or other belongings safely and out of anyone's way
- Let the driver drive without distraction during the journey
- Take care of the bus
- Never spit or smoke
- Never be rude to other learners or the driver
- · Never interfere with driver controls or safety equipment
- · Never throw anything in or from the bus
- Only operate the bus doors or exits in an emergency and don't get off the bus until it has stopped
- Always follow the instructions of the driver or passenger assistant
- If there is an accident, stay on the bus until you are told to leave – but leave the bus by the safest exit if it is unsafe to stay on the bus
- When crossing the road find a safe place where you can be seen by all other drivers
- Please tell a teacher, parent or driver about any bad behaviour you see


Blog on behalf of the School a class or club.


