It was lovely to be able to catch up with these young people who gave so much to Corpus Christi during their time here, and also with their parents who supported the school so fully. Hannah Woodhouse, the Managing Director of the Cardiff South Consortium, gave the opening address, congratulating the pupils upon their achievements and telling us something about her own fascinating background in education, including a spell in Whitehall. For those of you with a long association with Corpus Christi, it is a sobering fact that ‘reorganisation’ took place in September 1987, almost 30 years ago and that this ‘new’ school building officially opened in May 1996, just over 20 years ago!

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all parents for all their support and cooperation during this term, not least over the matter of shoes. I would like to make it clear, also, that every pupil must return to school in January in regulation footwear.

Finally, on behalf of all the staff and governors, I would like to wish you and your family a happy and holy Christmas.




# **A Night of Celebration and Glittering Prizes!**




## Cardiff Disability Games


When we arrived at The Huggard Centre my first impression was that it looked like a prison. We learned from a member of staff that it offers a day centre and 18 hostel rooms and for vulnerable people at night they offer floor space. When we arrived at The Salvation Army we gave a bag of socks and hats to the reception. They offer 60 hostel rooms and if they find any homeless people under the age of 18 social services will be contacted.



From this experience I have become more aware of homeless people and their issues and I know about the help that the centre offers and that Cardiff is one of best cities for helping the homeless. I also feel good for helping those who are less fortunate.

We provide a range of services including provision of clothing, bedding, toiletries and shower facilities as well as development opportunities and accommodation to help people to achieve this.




# Digital Day 2016

## WHAT THEY DID


