Don't forget to give your key or £2 to Mrs T Davies in Enquiries before the end of term.






A number of Year 11 ParentPay accounts are still in arrears. Please would all students and their parents ensure that these are repaid as soon as possible.



ATTENDANCE

The whole school attendance total is currently running at 95.75%, which is lower than we would want it to be for this time of year. The Welsh Assembly Government's target for **pupil attendance** is **95%**. Anything under this figure could mean that the Educational Welfare Service will contact you to find out why your child has been absent from school.

Below is a current breakdown of each Year Group's attendance:

Year 7	96.20%
Year 8	95.10%
Year 9	95.50%
Year 10	95.70%
Year 11	96.30%

- It is a parent's legal responsibility to ensure their child attends school every day.
- Parents responsible for children who exhibit poor attendance risk prosecution and a Fixed Penalty Notice fine being issued by the Local Authority.
- Children are not allowed to go on holiday during term time.

Absences due to Illness or Medical Appointment

Although you may have contacted the school by telephone, E-mail or in person to notify us of your child's absence, you are still required to provide a parental note, E-mail or appointment card in order for the absence to be authorised. In certain circumstances of illness medical evidence may be requested in order to authorise your child's absence.
