The Corpus Christi U14 Girls' Tennis Team have qualified for the South West England Regional Tennis Finals on 16th November in Exeter.

The team, consisting of Year 9 pupils Erin Piper, Caitlin Piper, Lucie John and Olivia Gillard have had an incredible run of success on their way to this amazing achievement.

They first won the Cardiff Schools Division 1 League back in July (other schools in the League were Cardiff High, Howells, Whitchurch and Radyr).

They then went on to win the South Wales Finals beating schools such as Bishopston, Stanwell, Llangatwg and Habadashers, Monmouth. This meant they had now qualified to enter the British Schools Knock Out rounds.

They were drawn against King Edwards School, Bath and hosted the match at Lisvane Tennis Club. Playing absolutely superbly on their home turf, they comfortably won 4-2, qualifying them for the South West Regional Finals (the last 16 in the UK).

This is an incredible achievement from 4 girls who are all passionate and committed pupils in all school sports. They are true team players; they are also members of the netball, hockey, xc, athletics and gymnastics squads and are fantastic role models for younger pupils. They also go out their way to help the PE department in extra-curricular activities such as running the lunchtime doubles tennis tournament in the summer term; officiating games and coaching younger players.
















Trip to Welsh Festival in Disneyland Paris

ATTENDANCE

The whole school attendance total is currently running at 96.71%. The final attendance figure for Academic Year 2016/17 was 95.81% and in order to improve or maintain this, we need to make sure that every pupil attends school regularly, therefore your continued support and cooperation is appreciated. The Welsh Assembly Government's target for pupil attendance is 95%. Anything under this figure could mean that the Educational Welfare Service will contact you to find out why your child has been absent from school.

Below is a current breakdown of each Year Group's attendance:

- It is a parent's legal responsibility to ensure their child attends school every day.
- Parents responsible for children who exhibit poor attendance risk prosecution and a Fixed Penalty Notice fine being issued by the Local Authority.
- Children are not allowed to go on holiday during term time.

Absences due to Illness or Medical Appointment

Although you may have contacted the school by telephone, E-mail or in person to notify us of your child's absence, you are still required to provide a parental note, E-mail or appointment card in order for the absence to be authorised. In certain circumstances of illness medical evidence may be requested in order to authorise your child's absence.

- feminine hygiene products


